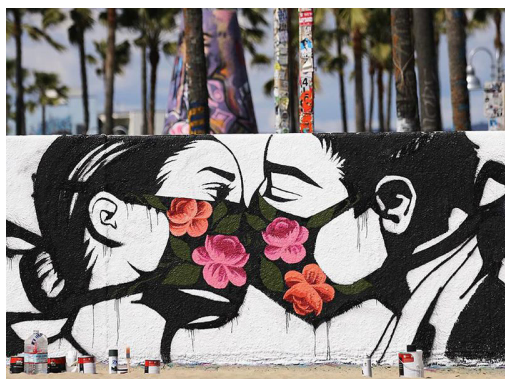
## Lockdown Art

For example - do you now wear a facemask when you go to the shops? Do you "Zoom" instead of meeting friends face to face?



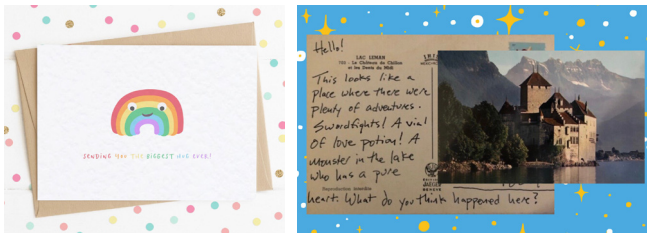

5) Brazilian muralist Kobra, Coexistence

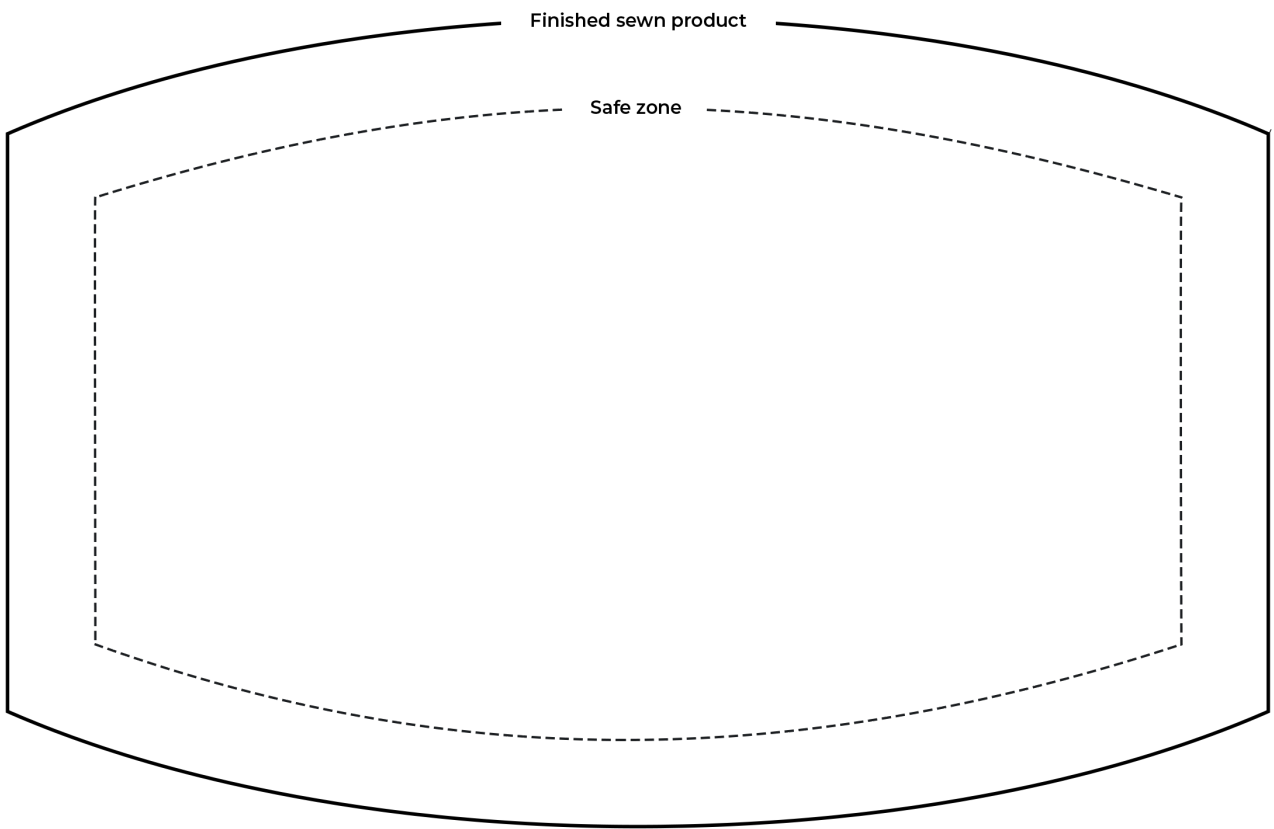
You could create some street inspired art with your message of hope to share with the world.
